**Mount Carmel pupils favored
RFK, Nixon as candidates**

A Mock Presidential Primary conducted Tuesday at Mount Carmel High School gave Sen. Robert F. Kennedy the edge over his two avowed Democratic opponents.

Forty-four per cent of 442 students registered as Democrats voted for the New York State Senator. Sen. Eugene McCarthy received 25 per cent of the Democratic vote; Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey, 29 per cent; and President Lyndon B. Johnson, two per cent in a write-in vote.

Richard M. Nixon led the Republican candidates with 54 per cent of the Republican vote. Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller received 39 per cent and California Gov. Ronald Reagan, eight per cent in a write-in.

Eighty-nine students registered as Independent, compared with 22 Republican, George Wallace garnered 70 per cent of the Independent vote.

Students were required to register last week to vote in the Primary Tuesday. Voting was conducted during study halls.

Six students representing the six avowed candidates spoke at a Tuesday morning assembly. They were Barbara Mrykot, representing Humphrey; Nancy Wright, McCarthy; Joan Myers, Kennedy; Curt Kovalasima, Wallace; David Gernak, Rockefeller; and Nancy Yura, Nixon.

The primary was sponsored

by the American History class of Sister Sharon Marie. Ann Peduto was chairman. Terri Burkhardt and Lorraine Donnelly were in charge of arrangements and conducting registrations.
