

Miss Murphy awarded second Mynderse diploma

Set against a background of 188 students at Mynderse Academy Sunday afternoon, Miss Alice Rose Murphy received an honorary diploma the second time around. Albert G. Plouffe, principal and David Ferrar, class president conferred the honor at the 99th commencement.

Born in 1882 in Seneca Falls of early Irish immigrants who came to the Seneca Falls area in the early 1800s from County Louth, Ireland, Miss Murphy was one of five children. After graduation from Mynderse in 1898 in a class of 15, she went to New York City to attend secretarial school, working as secretary until her retirement.

Graduates and guests gave Miss Murphy a standing ovation.

Miss Murphy lives in her home on Latham Street, Seneca Falls, overlooking Vant'leef Street. Her classmate and life long friend, Mary Harmon, lived with her until her death several years ago. She keeps busy with a garden in summer.

Miss Murphy says she is never lonely. She gets to the bank to take care of business and travels by taxi or with friends. She attends St. Patrick's Church.

Plouffe and officers of the 1973 Mynderse worked for several weeks on the anniversary honor and Principal Plouffe said of her "She is great. She is great to talk to. She is a wonderful person to talk to."

The picture of Miss Murphy's graduation class of 1898 hangs in the Seneca Falls Historical Museum and it was through this source and identification of her by a friend that the plan to honor her was initiated.

Today's recipe

PORCH REFRESHER
Sesame Wafers Iced Tea
SESAME WAFERS
These cookies should be paperthin and transparent.

1/2 cup unsifted flour
1/4 teaspoon baking powder
6 tablespoons butter
1 cup firmly packed light brown sugar
1 egg

1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1-3rd cup toasted sesame seed, see below

On wax paper thoroughly stir together the flour and baking powder. In a medium mixing bowl cream butter and brown sugar; beat in egg and vanilla. Stir in flour mixture, then sesame seeds. Drop by level teaspoonfuls, 2 inches apart, on a heavily greased cookie sheet. Bake in a preheated 325-degree oven until lightly browned — 8 to 10 minutes. Allow to cool a minute before removing, with a wide spatula, to wire racks. Makes about 7 dozen.

To toast sesame seed, sprinkle 1-3rd cup of the seeds over the bottom of a 12-by-9-by-1-inch pan. Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven, stirring a few times, until browned — about 10 minutes.
