SECOND MAN IN ARRESTS NEAR AUBURN CLEARED

Syracuse, N. Y., May 18 —(AP)—Edward Beartosek, 33, of Buffalo, has been cleared of a charge that he criminally received property allegedly stolen in an \$8,500 snuffing sweep.

Police Judge William H. Bambrick dismissed the charge yesterday.

Beartosek was arrested by state police near Auburn on April 9, along with Joseph Kosak, 32, and Mrs. Josephine Dembrowski, 35, both of Buffalo. Bambrick dismissed a similar charge last week against Kosak.

The judge yesterday adjourned Mrs. Dembrowski's case until May 31. She is charged with second degree grand larceny. State police claim they found garments stolen from Syracuse and Elmira stores in a car in which the three Buffalo residents were traveling.

David was a student in the first grade in Lincoln School.
