Veterans Urged to Wait For NSLI Dividend Checks

Don't Write, VA Administrator Gray Advises — Special Application Blanks Necessary For Payment Will Probably Be Available In August

Local veterans were urged today not to write to the Veterans Administration regarding a \$2,800,000,000 National Service Life Insurance dividend, announced last week by Carl R. Gray, Jr., Administrator of Veterans Affairs.

Official Facts
In answer to numerous inquiries he has received from veterans in this area, Mr. McGrath listed several official facts constituting "all of the official information now known about the dividend payment."

The facts are:

- (1) Amounts individual veterans will receive are not yet known, as individual computations have not yet been completed.
- (2) Generally every veteran who took out NSLI and kept it in force for three months or more will be eligible for a dividend check.
- (3) Mr. Gray has stated he hopes the dividends can be distributed starting sometime in January 1950, and payments substantially completed during the first half of 1950.
- (4) A special application blank is now being prepared and it is hoped that it can be printed in time to be available sometime in August at VA offices, postoffices, and veterans service organizations.
- (5) In cases where policy holders have died, the beneficiary of the policy, if the insurance was in force, or those shown to be entitled, if the insurance was lapsed, will receive the payment.
