

RESIDENT LEGISLATION FOR MRS. D. M. OSBORNE

Washington, July 27. — (AP) Legislation to permit Mrs. David M. Osborne of Auburn, N. Y., to remain in the United States was before President Truman today.

The Senate passed the measure yesterday. Mrs. Osborne is a native of New Zealand.

No Emergency Orders For Auburn Industries

No orders that could be classed as of war emergency nature have reached Auburn industrial plants nor have local factories given serious consideration to re-opening from their normal products to those of a military nature.
